Jerry Bentley, John Kelly, and Chuck Whitehead are our three deacons who will be seeking ordination, and we will give everyone in the church a chance to lay hands upon these leaders and share a word of guidance and encouragement. After all, the entire church elected these men for service, so it is only fitting that the entire congregation set them aside for this important servant ministry. Finally, more news on golf, specifically the first annual Vineville Baptist Robert Trent Jones golf trip. The dates are May 18-21. We will leave Macon early Monday morning, May 18, and tee off at the famed Grand National Golf Course, site of a 2015 PGA event. We should arrive early enough to get in a couple of rounds, (or you can opt for the 18-hole par three) before enjoying some of Auburn's best barbecue that evening. We will check in at a Comfort Inn in Montgomery that evening and get a good night's rest. Then we will drive less than an hour the next morning to one of the Southeast's hidden golf jewels, Cambrian Ridge in Greenville. There, three championship nines and a fabulous par three await us there. We will travel back to our motel that night, then on Wednesday challenge The Judge and The Senator, two famed courses of Capitol Hill, site of a 2015 LPGA event. We will be back in Macon by midday Thursday morning, the 21st. I have booked rooms at a very reasonable rate, assuming double occupancy. The cost of your golf is variable, but the best deal is to buy their spring package which would allow you to play 36 holes of golf a day (or more) including cart and tax, for \$114 a day. Overall cost of the trip for three nights lodging and the chance to play two fabulous courses a day, not including food, would be about \$470 per person. (We will car pool and share gas expenses.) Please sign up quickly, for space is limited, and I will need to book tee times no later than a week in advance. Hope you can make it. I intend to go whether I can swing a club or not!
