CELEBRATIONS OVERFLOWING

Every Sunday provides special opportunities for encountering the reality of God and affirming our status as part of the family of God. But next Sunday, October 29, will be one of those Sundays when all manner of observances and celebrations converge.

The day's celebration will begin in the Sunday School hour, when all of the classes are invited to participate in a combined meeting in the gym. A light breakfast will be provided by Kathy Kendrick's class for this Fifth Sunday gathering, and Pat Wilkes has been enlisted to teach the morning lesson. I know she will provide us with a blessing. Remember: Sunday School actually starts at 9:35 am. So don't be late for breakfast.

Next Sunday is also All Saints' Day. During the morning worship services we will honor the memory of those members in our congregation who have passed from our presence into God's eternal fellowship. We will read the names of each deceased member and mark their passing with a tolling of the chimes. This solemn occasion never fails to convey the profound reminder that our faith is not for this life only.

Finally, next Sunday marks the 500th anniversary of Martin Luther's nailing of his 95 Theses to the castle church door in Wittenburg, Germany. This event is credited with marking the beginning of the Protestant Reformation from which our Baptist faith eventually emerged. Martin Luther's influence upon our understanding of redemption is incalculable, an influence I will try to communicate through the message, "An Idea that Changed the World."

Incidentally, my Wednesday evening lectures over the next few weeks will describe the world in which Luther lived and how he changed it. This man's fascinating genius has shaped every aspect of our practice of the Christian life, including, Christmas. Come fellowship with us and learn more about the heritage of your faith.

Children of the church, I will see you this coming Friday, October 27, starting at 6 pm. You should have received a letter describing what to bring and a consent form that we ask the parents to bring with them. Don't forget your "throwing socks!" Melissa and I look forward to a great evening with you.

Operation Christmas Child shoeboxes have arrived. Most of you know what can and cannot be put in the boxes, but I will try to provide some detailed instructions of guidance in next week's Vision. We will present the shoeboxes in worship on Sunday, November 12, so be sure to bring yours to the church on time.

As I note in this Sunday's sermon, Thanksgiving will be upon us before we know it. In past years the WMU has collected food, particularly canned goods, for Thanksgiving meals that can be delivered to the needy. They want to continue that tradition. You can start bringing donations next week. Also, Eddie Wood and I have combined efforts to supplement these boxes of food with cooked turkeys. If you have the equipment and desire to help me during Thanksgiving week in frying some turkeys, please let me know.

Also, as you start your holiday shopping keep this in mind: those of you who shop on Amazon can designate the church as a recipient of an Amazon donation for each purchase you make on Amazon.
