EVERY COLOR MEANS SOMETHING!

As we gather this morning I hope that you began this day of worship by enjoying our Advent breakfast. We thank Melissa and her cadre of dedicated helpers for rising early and preparing our celebratory meal. Thanks to all who gave of their time and talent to prepare, serve and clean up after the breakfast. And thanks to all who rose early to partake of their gift to us.

I welcome you this morning to my favorite service of the year – the Hanging of the Green. I have tried in vain to ascertain when the liturgical practice of adorning the sanctuary at Advent in preparation for the coming of the Christ began. Apparently the practice has its roots in England, where households began hanging evergreens outside their homes on the first Sunday of Advent. And yet, as I will explain this morning, every aspect of the service, every act of adornment, has its roots in Christian traditions that go back many centuries. Every color with which we decorate our sanctuary carries theological significance. Every color means something!

I express gratitude to everyone who donated a poinsettia in memory or honor of someone, and thanks to everyone who fills a role this morning in helping us decorate our sanctuary to the glory of God. Special thanks go to all of the choir leaders, accompanists, instrumentalists and singers who are sharing their talents with us today. The highlight of the service will be a "sermon in song" delivered by our joined choirs. What a delight!

Speaking of sermons in song, next week we have a special treat in store for us. During our combined worship service at 10:45 am, our adult choir, accompanied by orchestra, will present *God Came Near*. Our choir's Christmas music always conveys meaning and wonder. I encourage you to come and invite a friend. This will be another joyous service of worship.

Remember also that we have two special events before us on successive Wednesday nights in December. This coming Wednesday, December 11, at 6:45 pm, the children's and youth choirs of the church will be presenting their Christmas concert in the sanctuary. You will not want to miss this enjoyable evening of music.

On the following Wednesday, December 18, we have a special treat for you, a presentation by the "Vineville Church Players" of a three-act comedy entitled, *The Christmas Maker*. The play will take place in the sanctuary at 6:45 pm. The multi-generational cast, which is vast, has been working since October on this drama, and I promise they will delight you. We invite you not only to come but to invite friends and neighbors. This is definitely meant to be an outreach event. We will have our usual Wednesday night meal that evening beginning at 5:30 pm. Even if you don't normally eat with us, plan to do so that night. This will be our last Wednesday night gathering of 2019.

If you have not already done so, be sure to pick up our 2019 Advent booklet. The booklet features stories, testimonials, artwork and Scriptures for every day of Advent, continuing through Christmas Day. Again, many thanks go to Jody Thornton and Melissa Kremer for their hard work in shaping our entries into a publishable form! And thanks to all who offered a contribution to this meaningful Advent instrument.

Sunday, December 22, the Fourth Sunday of Advent, will be our Pledge Sunday. We will take time that Sunday to bring our pledge cards to the altar as an expression of our gratitude to God for the gift of the Christ. This is always a meaningful and powerful communal expression of stewardship. If you are not able to be present that Sunday, please mail your pledge card in as soon as possible.

The Christmas Eve "Candles, Carols and Communion," service will be at 5 pm. And remember, if you have picked up an Angel Tree request or a Salvation Army stocking, note that they need to be returned by Tuesday, December 10.
